New equipment made mostly from natural materials will encourage imaginative play. The varied colour theme will draw all the elements together into making two beautiful play areas which complement the two parks' environments.

'I am especially impressed that Council obviously made an effort to listen to the community', said Ruth May, manager of Green Ponds Recreation Centre. 'It would be hard to please everybody, but it seems to me that the end result will be brilliant!'
